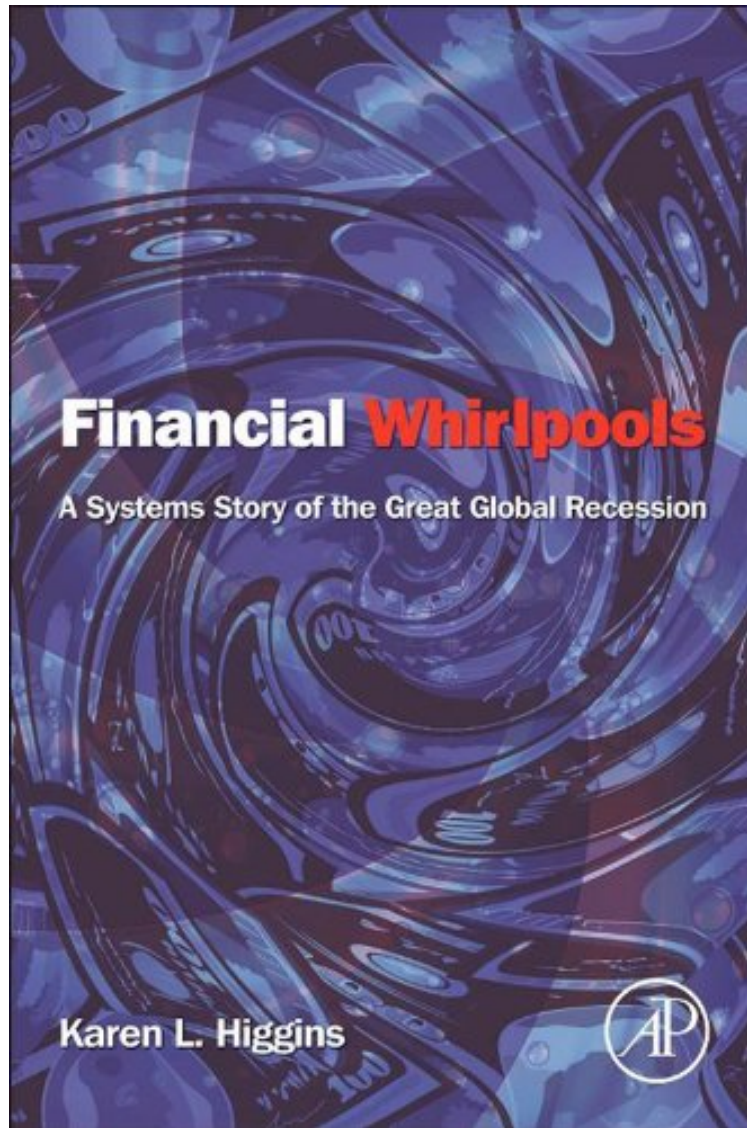

SchropferThis book is an in depth study for the 2007-2008 financial collapse and ensuing Global Recession. Unlike many other books on the subject, the author spends a great deal of time looking at all the players: home buyers,

mortgage brokers, banks, rating agencies and myriad others, all of whom played their part in the story. Using a "Systems way of thinking" she lays out the perverse incentives and interactions that drove the economy to the brink. The reader will gain a good understanding of the crisis as well as an introduction to the basics of Systems Engineering. The work is full of analogies and metaphors that help to explain the complexities of the crisis in laymen's terms. These are balanced with the "loops, lags, limits and levers" of a rigorous systems analysis of the collapse. By the end of the book, the reader will have a new understanding of what went wrong, and a new prescription of remedies to keep it from happening again. The introduction to "Systems Analysis" will serve the reader well in his thinking of other issues facing us that require more than a linear approach if they are to be understood. I highly recommend the book to anyone who is interested in a thorough approach to the analysis of complex systems that affect us all.
