Rogers' experience as a coach in this field comes through on every page - it's practical, down-to-earth advice that should work for anyone who

is about to jump onto the pre-employment treadmill. Chapter one provides a number of self-analysis tools to help you discover your motivation for the intended job. Anyone who carries out these exercises, will I'm sure, not only find out whether they actually do want the job, but in the process find out a lot about themselves. The remainder of the book, although not filled with such analytical tools, poses many questions for the candidate that will help them through all phases of the recruitment process. It also has many checklists, tips and personal examples that show how difficult situations/questions might best be handled. As someone who has also been in the recruitment field, I was impressed with this book not only because it covered the obvious topics (such as dress code, handling nerves etc.) but because Rogers often puts a different spin on them (such as acting as a facilitator if you happen to be in a team assessment centre).
