For one, while it is true that a resume should be written in the first person, it should not include the word "I," as suggested as a possibility by

the author. The "I" should be understood but not used in print. If this is a new trend, my guess is that most hiring managers will see the use of "I" as an error, not a new trend or an acceptable practice.
