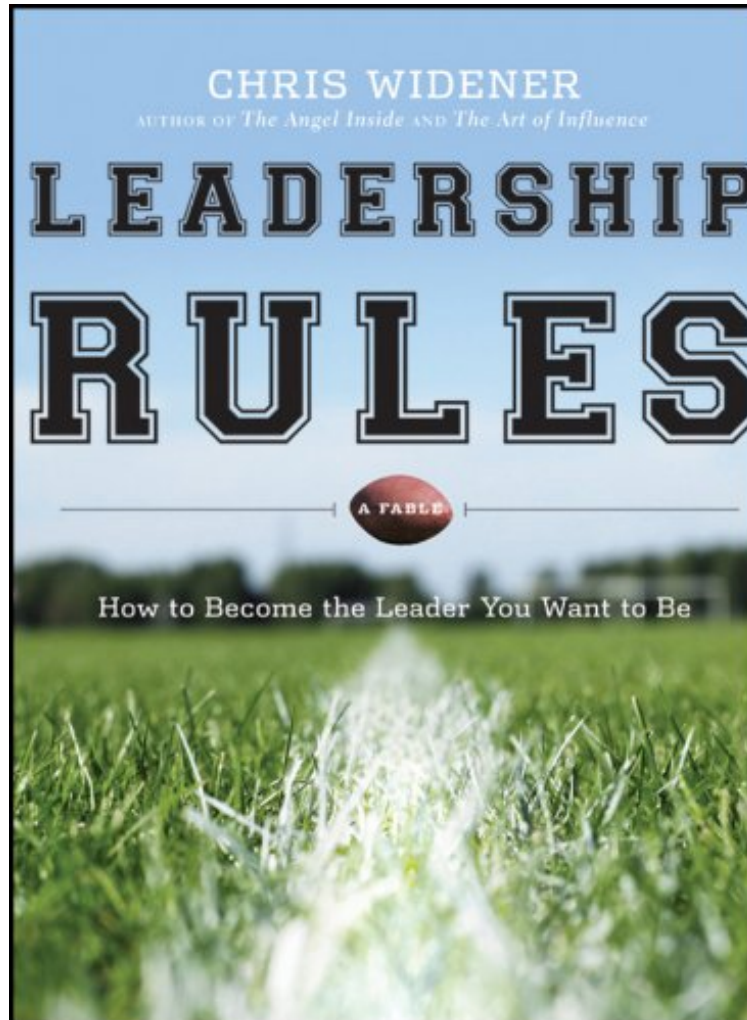

I read it in just a few hours start to finish and it kept me engaged all the way through. It is a delightful story reminiscent of Ken Blanchard's stories with lessons learned and friendships found. The things that stood out for me were, one, the first lesson: We get what we expect. I need that reminder every day of my life. It is more commonly called belief, and it is the driving force for realization of thought driven ideals. It is amazing how many times I have wanted something to happen, wanted someone to perform a certain way, but I really, deep down, didn't expect it. In that, I got what I expected most often, though it wasn't necessarily what I wanted. So, this first lesson reminded me to match up what I want with what I expect. The second thing that hit home

with me was rule number three: We get what we reward. As a sales manager for over 40 years, I've seen this dealt with in so many ways and most of them ineffectively. I was well aware of the rule, but I have to admit that I needed the reminder to reward what we want from others. None of us can do it alone, so by thinking of them and what they want, we can get more of what we want. It is so very powerful. Then, of course, I loved being reminded that I need to lead by example. I work on leading that way every day, and I will need to the rest of my life. Leaders are so visible. Being a part of the team is critical to the health of the team.
