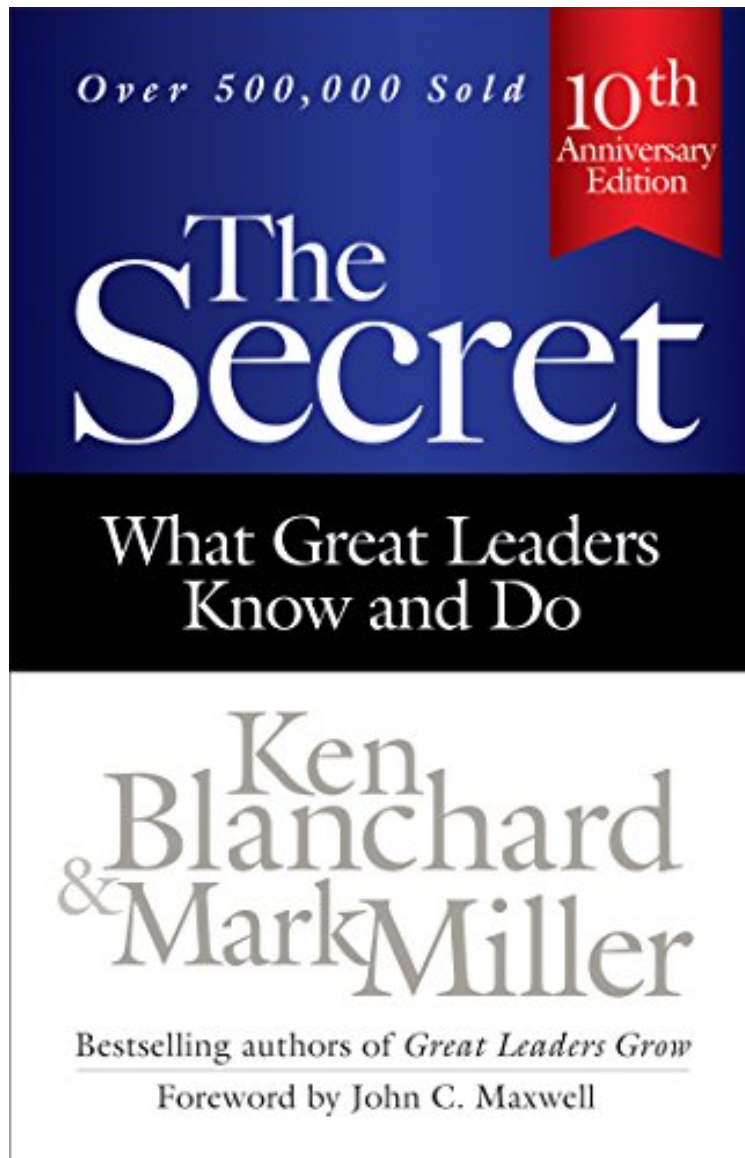

The book is written as a fictional story (think of Patrick Lencioni's leadership fables) and follows Debbie Brewster, a leader who has been struggling. As a result,

she applies for a new mentoring program at her organization. She is selected to participate, and the mentor she is assigned to is Jeff Brown, the president of the company. In their first meeting Debbie asks Jeff "What is the secret of great leaders?" He responds that the secret is that great leaders SERVE. The book follows Debbie through her monthly mentoring meetings with Jeff as he takes her through the SERVE model. We see her applying what she has learned in those sessions, and as a result growing as a leader. The SERVE model is: S - See the Future. E - Engage and Develop Others. R - Reinvent Continuously. V - Value Results and Relationships. E - Embody the Values. This quick read communicates helpful messages about being a servant leader via an interesting story about a leader who was struggling. It also includes some helpful resources at the end of the book, including a self-assessment and frequently asked questions.
