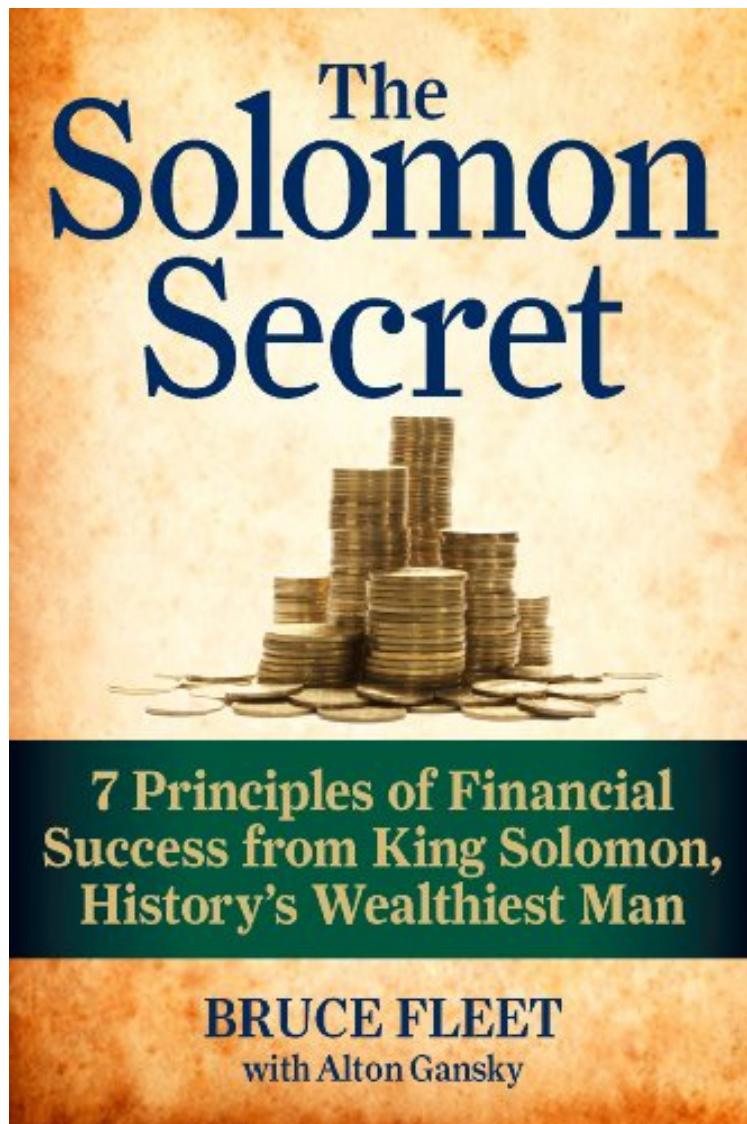

The author has a good handle on decent if ubiquitous bare-bones financial wisdommdash;the importance of long-term planning, ethical business dealings, altruism, living below your means and business savvy, but he splices his advice, somewhat perplexingly, with stories of King Solomon and his young proteacut;geacute;, Abidan. Fleet's admiration of Solomonmdash;who he claims was the richest and wisest man of all time (even after adjusting for inflation and IQ reporting) comes through loud and clear, but the connection between the biblical stories and the financial lessons feels contrived at best. By attempting to juxtapose two very different objectives, Fleet has created a book that's neither fish nor fowlmdash;with no obvious messagemdash;tied together by a gimmick with limited appeal.
