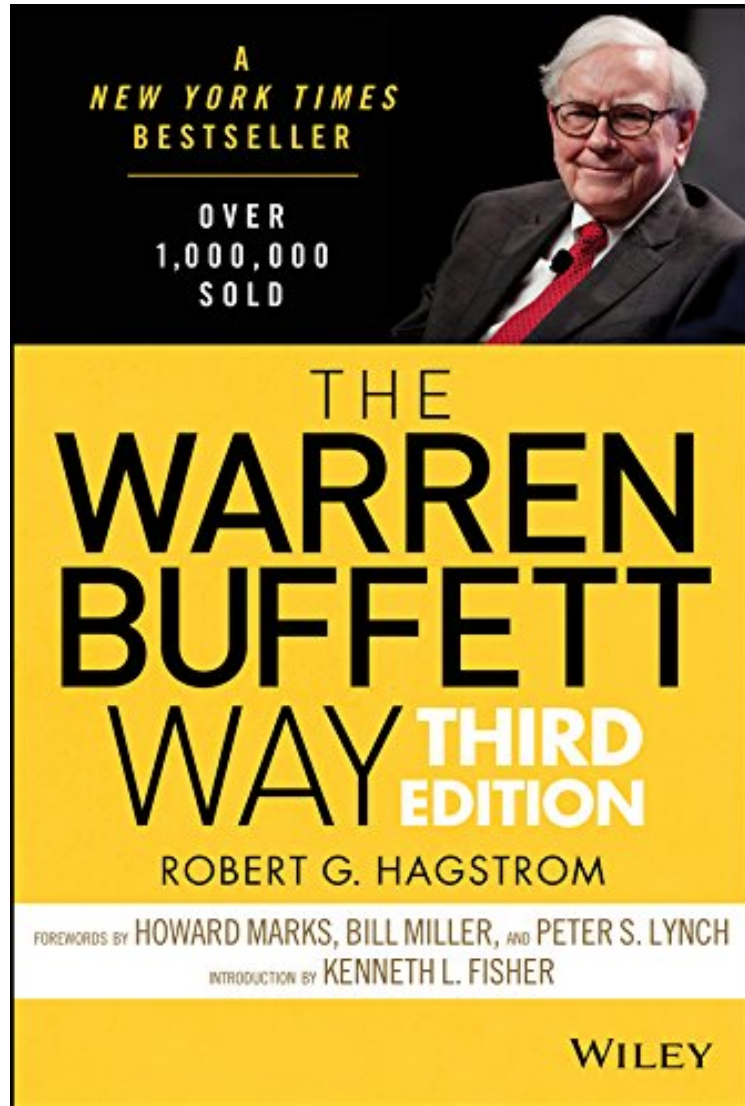

It makes me think -- and feel -- the importance of studying, and of course, what to actually study. I have a hard time understanding Annual Reports (from publicly traded companies), as all those accounting terms, and GAAP standards (hardy har har) make it difficult to figure out if a company is making more money than it spends, but more importantly Hagstrom's book gives an insight into Buffett's approach which includes, as an example, reading all those "footnotes", as well getting a feel for whether management is doing what they say they're going to do. I think that companies' annual reports are partly "boilerplate" info, but I also think they are INTENDED to obfuscate, since the real question is to determine whether a company makes more than it spends (profit), and secondly whether shareholders tend to benefit (or if the company plows that cash back into their own agenda).
