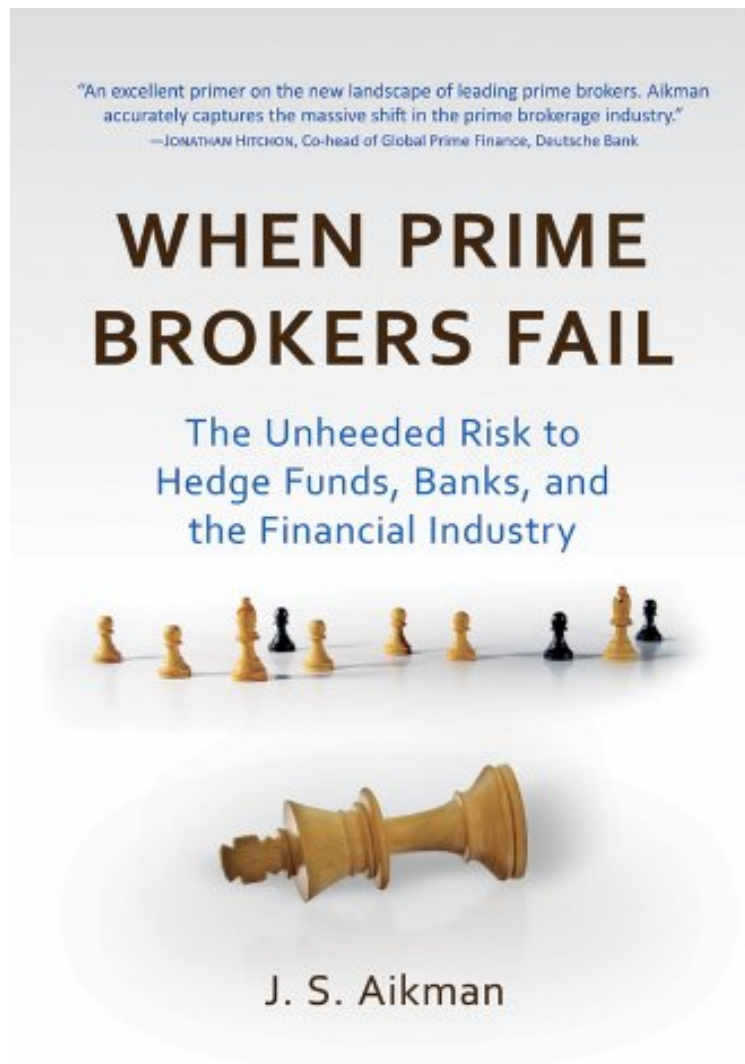

Stuart BJon Aikman's 'When Prime Brokers Fail' presents the key rules and concepts underlying the business of prime brokerage, and highlights well the critical position these sometimes under emphasized institutions take in our modern financial system. His book presents clearly the complex relationships between Prime Brokers and their many clients, as well as the motivations and risks behind their business model — both before and after the Lehman failure. Written primarily from a legal standpoint, the book excels as an introduction to the many laws governing the industry, how they have been implemented, and how they have evolved. Sometimes dry and to the point, the book is dense with facts, and offers only a basic level of analysis. As an educational text for those on the peripheries of the subject it is therefore excellent, but as an engaging read for those with a passing interest in how and why the 2008 crisis unfolded it is probably less suitable.
